1. All students must carry a **valid original photo ID proof** (Old College ID, Passport, Aadhaar, Etc) and **Exam admit cards**. If you were absent for the first round of exams, you can carry the same admit card for the second round of exams (you will not receive any confirmation/admit card again).

3. The candidates must check the Class room number/seat allotment list displayed on the notice board and take seats 15 minutes before the commencement of the exam.
4. The candidates will receive an exam admit card by mail after successfully applying for the course. Those who have not received the admit slip can meet the help desk 45 minutes before the commencement of the exam.
