ADMISSION PROCESS FOR UG AND PG

- a) Applicants should read the criteria of eligibility for each undergraduate and postgraduate courses that are available, on the college website www.sjc.ac.in
- (b) If the results of II PU/12th Std. are not announced, applications can be submitted with the marks of 11th standard or 1st Pre-University course. Those who apply for B.Com. course, should update their marks as and when their final results are declared on the websites of their respective boards. Their selection for the interview is based on the marks obtained in 12th/II PUC marks of final exam. Those who apply for PG courses, can apply with their previous semester/year marks, if the final semester marks cards are not available.
- (c) There will be an entrance test only for BAVC, B.Voc, EJP and BCA among UG courses. Entrance test dates are announced on the website and are also displayed on the college notice board. Other under graduate courses will not have entrance test. Entrance exam would be conducted for M.A. in Journalism and Mass Communication, English, Economics and Political Science of the PG Courses.
- (d) The fees for the application form for UG courses is Rs 400/-. The application fees for PG courses is Rs 600/-. The fees for UG and PG courses are to be paid by NEFT Credit/Debit card. (Please check the website for account details). Those who make the payment by NEFT may have to wait for upto 48 hours for the approval of the UTF before filling in the application form.
- (e) If the applicant is unable to submit the application form ONLINE, he/she could come to college, along with the soft copy of passport size photo, copies of relevant marks card and UTR number of the NEFT transaction. The personnel at the help desk will help you to do the needful.
- (f) After the application form is successfully completed and submitted ONLINE, say the document in a PDF format for your reference.
- (g) The date and time for the interview for the selected applicants will be notified by email and sms. Please ensure that you take extra care while entering the email and the mobile number in the online application form. Please check your inbox/spam fo Ider regularly for any communication from the college authorities regarding selection interview/admission
- (h) Applicants who are called for the interview should bring along with them a hard copy of the application form, photocopies of all marks cards and caste certificate (if applicable). Roman Catholics are expected to bring Certificate of Baptism for the interview.
- (i) After the final interview, the selected applicants have to pay their course fees within 24 hours. The fee structure is displayed on the website and on the college notice boa rd. Upon payment of fees, the counterfoil of the bank challan must be produced at the COE's office to obtain the class registered number and the student ID card.
- (j) Until the student submits all the original marks cards, transfer certificate, migratic certificate*, caste certificate (if applicable) to the college office for verification, admission to the college is provisional. If the candidate is found ineligible as per the eligibility criteria, the admission will be cancelled and fees paid will not be refunded under any circumstance.
- *Migration certificate: For those undergraduate applicants who have completed PUC/12th Std. from PU boards of other states. Postgraduate applicants who have completed their degree outside Rangalore University.

Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) is implemented in the college. It gives UG and PG students an opportunity to learn different subjects within and across disciplines.

Statutory Committees in the Campus:

Examination and Student Evaluation

For each course, there will be both Continuous Assessment (CA) and semester exartination (SE), with weightage in the ratio of 30:70. A student must secure a minimum of 35% of marks in SE and a minimum of 40% of marks in the aggregate of the two to pass the course. Apart from this condition, a PG student must score minimum of 50% of marks in the aggregate of all papers, to pass the semester.

Continuous Assessment

The CA consists of written tests and activities like seminars, assignments, projects, quizzes, and discussions. The 30% of CA will be divided as follows:

UG students- written test (15% - there will be one test of 11/2 hours duration per semester), activity (10%- students will have to take one of the activity as prescribed by the department) and attendance (5%).

PG students- written test (20%, there will be one test of 11/2 hours duration per semester) and activity (10%).

Semester Examinations

There are two semesters in an academic year. No student is eligible to write the semester examinations without obtaining a minimum of 75% attendance in each paper. If a student has shortage of attendance in more than one paper, he or she will have to repeat the semester in the following academic year. However, if a student has shortage of attendance in one subject, he/she may be allowed to write all other papers except the one in which there is shortage. The student will be allowed to write the examination in that paper, only after earning a minimum 75% attendance in that particular paper by enrolling in the respective paper after completing 6 semesters. PG students with shortage of attendance in one subject will have to apply for attending the course and examination after completing 4 semesters.

NCC, NSS, Sports, Games, Cultural and Social Outreach

The College is reputed for NCC, NSS, sports, games, cultural activities and social our each. There are student committees with staff coordinators to run these activities. Every year, Josephites win several trophies and championships in inter-collegiate competitions in sports, games and cultural activities are also held. The Centre for Social Concern links the College with the local community. Students have to earn a certain number of credits by their involvement in activities beyond the classroom.
