PUBLICATION:

All accepted papers will be published in the edited book, provided papers are received by the appropriate deadline and conform to the format requirements. Unpublished papers of high quality and original in nature will only be published. Any form of plagiarism is strictly prohibited. The cost of publication will be intimated later.
