

Outreach Program

In pursuance with the Jesuit Higher Education, the highest authority on Higher Education in India, the University Grants Commission, has recognized the relevance and importance of the purpose and practice of 'Extension' as integral to the process of learning. It expects universities and colleges, given their knowledge, human resources and infrastructure, to become positive change-makers who would empower the marginalized of society.

In view of implementing recommendations of the UGC on Extension service and for promoting the vision of St. Joseph's Institutions of 'forming women and men for others,' the Outreach Program was made mandatory for our students from this academic year 2016 - 17. We are happy to place on record that students' participation in this program has been very encouraging. The Majority of the students have expressed that Outreach Program has helped them to understand the challenges and the problems faced by the disadvantaged and vulnerable sections of society and inculcated a sense of social responsibility in them to make meaningful interventions aimed at building a just and equitable society.

We had organized four forms for programs for the students this year 2016 - 17, namely:

Rural exposure camps and planting of saplings in Raichur District

The Post Graduate students were sent to Manvi, Raichur for the Rural Exposure camps. During these camps, they have planted over 1,500 saplings in St. Xavier School campus, Manvi town. Apart from planting, they were also sent to villages and slums to interact with common people. These visits have helped them to become aware of various forms of discrimination suffered by Lambanis, Devadasis and dalits in the periphery of our society.

2. Tuition classes for the students of Government Schools.

The students of Commerce Sections were sent to 20 Government Schools on weekdays to take tuition classes for the school kids. The Staff and students of these schools are very appreciative of the services rendered by our students. Most of the staff members have shared that our students have succeeded in motivating the school kids to do better in their studies. Reversal of roles (as students in the college and teachers in Government schools) has helped our students to become more disciplined and organized.

“Since our main event was teaching, we taught students few topics under core subjects. Then we conducted small indoor games for the students in the classrooms and made them have good fun time. The students showed interest in studies as well as in other activities. I was accompanied by 6 of my classmates who were also part of the outreach program. We divided ourselves into different sections and took classes for a span of 1 hour. We were asked to teach only core subjects by the Principle. We taught social, science, mathematics and sometimes conducted general knowledge quiz for the students. This was our week task-table in the school. On the last day, we planned a different activity where few students gave review and feedback about our teaching and we also narrated small stories to the students which added to the beauty of the concluding day. Plan for the year 2016 – 17

We are planning to join hands with some like minded citizen forums and NGO's to encourage our programme. In view of this plan in we have contacted :

1. **WOMEN'S Voice – in collaboration with them we will be teaching to the slum Children of Siddapura slum . We have identified five centres within this slum and our Post Graduate students will work in these centres.**
2. **We have visited three graveyards of Christians, Hindus and Muslims in Shanthinagar. We are planning to conduct tuition to children of grave diggers in graveyard premises.**
3. **In collaboration with Eco Team of Bangalore we plan to spread awareness with regard to harmful effects of plastic materials and help in banning plastic.**
4. **We plan to take students to HIV Positive children at Snahadan and cancer patients at Karunayshraya.**
5. **We are studying the possibility of joining hands with KILL BILL Movement to make our city walls of public premises clean.**

We were also invited by the MBA sections of Christ University to share our experience about Outreach Programme. Christ University has also planned to make it mandatory for their 650 MBA students put in 15 hours of community service in two years.

We have also used our old exam answer papers in collaboration with WOW Bangalore – ITC group to recycle and produce note books to distribute to the students of primary schools administered by the Govt. of Karnataka.
